

Duxbury Town: Census 2000 Data Report

As of 2000, Duxbury had a population of 1,289, comprised mainly of rural residents. The population has actually increased by 32% since 1990. Duxbury contains more males than females. Approximately 53% of the total population is male, while 47% is female. Table A. shows the breakdown of age groups amongst the total population in Duxbury. Approximately 25% of the population is children, age 18 and under, while 9% of the population is senior citizens, age 65 and over. The number of residents age 18 and under and age 65 and over has increased throughout the last decade. There are currently 16.7% more children and 32.6% more senior citizens in Duxbury than there were in 1990.

Of the total population in Duxbury, 97.4% live in households. Of these people, 83% live in family households, while 17% live in nonfamily households. Of the 499 total households in Duxbury, 69% are family households, while 31% are nonfamily households. Most of the family households contain 2 to 4 persons. Approximately 42% are 2-person households, while 22% are 3-person households, and 25% are 4-person households. Most of the nonfamily households contain 1 or 2 persons. Approximately 69% are 1-person households and 27% are 2-person households. Compared to 1990, there are currently 37.5% more households in Duxbury. See Table B. for details related to household data.

Of the 345 total families that reside in Duxbury, approximately 87% are married-couple families. Of these married-couple families, 44% have children under the age of 18, while 56% do not have children under the age of 18. The remaining 13% of families in Duxbury fall under the category of other family. See Table C. for details. Approximately 43% of these families have a female householder with no husband present, while 57% of these families have a male householder with no wife present. In total, there are 19.4% more families residing in Duxbury than there were in 1990.

In Duxbury, there are 730 workers age 16 and over, which is a 32.7% increase from 1990. Approximately 10% of these workers work in Duxbury, while 90% work outside

of the community. The majority of workers, 91%, travel to work by car, truck, van, or motorcycle. Approximately 84% of those who travel to work by car, truck, van, or motorcycle drive alone, while 16% use carpools. See Table D. for other means of transportation used by workers in Duxbury. Although there are a range of travel times for Duxbury workers, 36% commute between 5 and 19 minutes. Approximately 33% commute between 20 and 39 minutes. Only 4.2% travel less than 5 minutes to work, while 2% travel more than 90 minutes to work from Duxbury.

In Duxbury, there were 324 people attending school at some level in 2000, which is a 50.7% increase from 1990. A range of educational attainment is represented by the population in Duxbury. Only 0.3% of all residents 25 years and older have not completed any level of schooling, while 31% have only a high school diploma. Approximately 41% of Duxbury residents 25 years and older hold some type of degree, ranging from an Associates degree to a Doctorate degree. See Table E. for details.

In Duxbury, there are 804 residents in the labor force, which is 79% of the population age 16 and over. This is a 43.6% increase from 1990. Approximately 93% of the people in the civilian labor force are employed, while 7% are unemployed. The 56 residents of Duxbury that are unemployed represent 460% more than the unemployment level in 1990. All of the industries covered in the Census are represented by residents of Duxbury. The industries with the largest percentage of workers are: education, health, and social services, which represents 17.4% of employed residents; manufacturing, which represents 12.4% of employed residents; public administration, which represents 12.3%

of employed residents; and retail trade, which represents 12.2% of employed residents. See Table F. for details.

Table G. shows household income and family income data for Duxbury. All income classes are represented here. Approximately 4% of the total households have an income of less than \$10,000; 18.5% have an income between \$10,000 and \$25,000; 29% have an income between \$25,000 and \$50,000; 25% have an income between \$50,000 and \$75,000; 13.5% have an income between \$75,000 and \$100,000; and 9.5% have an income above \$100,000. In 1999, the median household income for Duxbury was \$47,981, which is a 49.3% increase from 1990. Approximately 0.9% of the total families have an income of less than \$10,000; 9.5% have an income between \$10,000 and \$25,000; 30% have an income between \$25,000 and \$50,000; 30% have an income between \$50,000 and \$75,000; 15.5% have an income between \$75,000 and \$100,000; and 13.5% have an income above \$100,000. In 1999, the median family income in Duxbury was \$57,574, which is a 66.8% increase from 1990. In 1999, the per capita income for Duxbury was \$20,707, a 49.3% increase from 1990. Approximately 5% of people in Duxbury for whom poverty status is determined have incomes below poverty level. Unfortunately, the 64 residents who have an income below poverty level are 60% more than those who suffered from poverty in 1990.

There are 569 total housing units in Duxbury. Approximately 12% are located in an urban area, while 88% are located in a rural area. This is a 28.7% increase from the total housing units in 1990. Approximately 88% of these housing units are currently occupied, leaving only 12% vacant. None of these vacant housing units are for rent, while 8.5% are for sale. There are currently 10.1% less housing vacancies in Duxbury than there were in 1990, as the occupancy level has increased by 37.2% over the last decade. See Table H. for details.

Of the 498 total occupied housing units in Duxbury, 59% are 1 to 2 person households, while 33% are 3 to 4 person households. Of the 569 total housing units in the Town, most have between 4 and 7 rooms. Approximately 4% have 1 to 2 rooms; 24% have 3 to 4 rooms; 36% have 5 to 6 rooms; 28% have 7 to 8 rooms; and 8% have 9 or more rooms. Many of the housing units in Duxbury were built prior to 1980. Approximately 23% of the houses were built before 1939; 36% were built between 1940 and 1979; and 40% were built after 1980. Approximately 95% of the total housing units in Duxbury contain complete plumbing facilities, leaving 5% without adequate plumbing. See Table J. for details.
