

# Middlesex Town: Census 2000 Data Report

## Section 1: General Population Data

As of 2000, Middlesex had a population of 1,743, comprised completely of rural residents. The population has increased by 15.1% since 1990. Middlesex contains more females than males. Approximately 51% of the total population is female, while 49% is male. Table A. shows the breakdown of age groups amongst the total population in Middlesex. Approximately 29% of the population is children, age 18 and under, while 6.5% of the population is senior citizens, age 65 and over. The number of residents age 18 and under and age 65 and over has increased throughout the last decade. There are currently 5.7% more children and 14% more senior citizens in Middlesex than there were in 1990.

Of the total population in Middlesex, 100% live in households. Of these people, 87% live in family households, while 13% live in nonfamily households. Of the 644 total households in Middlesex, 75% are family households, while 25% are nonfamily households. Most of the family households contain 2 to 4 persons. Approximately 38% are 2-person households, while 28% are 3-person households, and 22% are 4-person households. Most of the nonfamily households contain 1 or 2 persons. Approximately 72% are 1-person households and 24% are 2-person households. Compared to 1990, there are currently 17.7% more households in Middlesex. See Table B. for details related to household data.

Of the 485 total families that reside in Middlesex, approximately 84% are married-couple families. Of these married-couple families, 50% have children under the age of 18, while 50% do not have children under the age of 18. The remaining 16% of families in Middlesex fall under the category of other family. See Table C. for details. Approximately 68% of these families have a female householder with no husband present, while 32% have a male householder with no wife present. In total, there are 20.3% more families residing in Middlesex than there were in 1990.

In Middlesex, there are 1,005 workers age 16 and over, which is an 18.5 % increase from 1990. Approximately 15% of these workers work in Middlesex, while 85% work outside of the community. The majority of workers, 90%, travel to work by car, truck, van, or motorcycle. Approximately 85% of those who travel to work by car, truck, van, or motorcycle drive alone, while 15% use carpools. See Table D. for other means of transportation used by workers in Middlesex. Although there are a range of travel times for Middlesex workers, 38% commute between 5 and 19 minutes. Approximately 37% commute between 20 and 39 minutes. Only 2% travel less than 5 minutes to work, while 1% travel more than 90 minutes to work from Middlesex.

In Middlesex, there were 442 people attending school at some level in 2000, which is a 23.5% increase from 1990. A range of educational attainment is represented by the population in Middlesex. Only 0.2% of all residents 25 years and older have not completed any level of schooling, while 25.5% have only a high school diploma. Approximately 48% of Middlesex residents 25 years and older hold some type of degree, ranging from an Associates degree to a Doctorate degree. See Table E. for details.

In Middlesex, there are 1,045 residents in the labor force, which is 79.5% of the population age 16 and over. This is a 15% increase from 1990. Approximately 97% of the people in the civilian labor force are employed, while 3% are unemployed. The 29 residents that are unemployed represent 32.6% less than the unemployment level in 1990. All of the industries covered in the Census are represented by residents of Middlesex. The industries with the largest percentage of workers are: education, health, and social services, which represents 21.3% of employed residents; public administration, which represents 13.6% of employed residents; and retail trade, which represents 12.2% of employed residents. Table G. shows household income and family income data for Middlesex. All income classes are represented here. Approximately 5% of the total households have an income of less than \$10,000; 15% have an income between \$10,000 and \$25,000; 28% have an income between \$25,000 and \$50,000; 27% have an income between \$50,000 and \$75,000; 12% have an income between \$75,000 and \$100,000; and 13% have an income above \$100,000. In 1999, the median household income in Middlesex was \$51,765, which is a 39.6% increase from 1990. Approximately 3% of the total families have an income of less than \$10,000; 11% have an income between \$10,000 and \$25,000; 26% have an income between \$25,000 and \$50,000; 29% have an income between \$50,000 and \$75,000; 15% have an income between \$75,000 and \$100,000; and 16% have an income above \$100,000. In 1999, the median family income in Middlesex was \$58,527, which is a 48.3% increase from 1990. In 1999, the per capita income for Middlesex was \$22,965, a 48.6% increase from 1990. Approximately 6% of people in Middlesex for whom poverty status is determined have incomes below poverty level. Unfortunately, the 107 residents who have incomes below poverty level are 78.3% more than those who suffered from poverty in 1990.

There are 715 total housing units in Middlesex, all of which are located in a rural area. This is an 18.4% increase from the total housing units in 1990. Approximately 92% of these housing units are currently occupied, leaving only 8% vacant. Of these vacant housing units, none are for rent, while 11% are for sale. Approximately 60% of the vacant housing units are for seasonal, recreational, or occasional use. There are currently

3.5% less housing vacancies in Middlesex than there were in 1990 and the occupancy level has increased by 20.7% over the last decade. See Table H. for details.

Of the 660 total occupied housing units in Middlesex, 53% are 1 to 2 person households, while 39% are 3 to 4 person households. Of the 715 total housing units in the Town, most have between 4 and 7 rooms. Approximately 4% have 1 to 2 rooms; 19% have 3 to 4 rooms; 40% have 5 to 6 rooms; 24% have 7 to 8 rooms; and 12% have 9 or more rooms. Many of the housing units in Middlesex were built prior to 1980. Approximately 23% of the houses were built before 1939; 37% were built between 1940 and 1979; and 40% were built after 1980. Approximately 94% of the total housing units in Middlesex contain complete plumbing facilities, leaving 6% without adequate plumbing. See Table J. for details.
