

Warren Town: Census 2000 Data Report

As of 2000, Warren had a population of 1,681, comprised completely of rural residents. The population has increased by 43.4% since 1990. Warren contains more males than females. Approximately 51% of the total population is male, while 49% is female. Table A. shows the breakdown of age groups amongst the total population in Warren. Approximately 24% of the population is children, age 18 and under, while 9.5% of the population is senior citizens, age 65 and over. The number of residents age 18 and under and age 65 and over has increased throughout the last decade. There are currently 44.8% more children and 112% more senior citizens in Warren than there were in 1990.

Of the total population in Warren, 100% live in households. Of these people, 78% live in family households, while 22% live in nonfamily households. Of the 741 total households in Warren, 58% are family households, while 42% are nonfamily households. Most of the family households contain 2 to 4 persons. Approximately 47% are 2-person households, while 26% are 3-person households, and 19% are 4-person households. Most of the nonfamily households contain 1 or 2 persons. Approximately 77% are 1-person households and 21% are 2-person households. Compared to 1990, there are currently 44.7% more households in Warren. See Table B. for details related to household data.

Of the 432 total families that reside in Warren, approximately 87% are married-couple families. Of these married-couple families, 43% have children under the age of 18, while 57% do not have children under the age of 18. The remaining 13% of families in Warren fall under the category of other family. See Table C. for details. Approximately 66% of these families have a female householder with no husband present, while 34% have a male householder with no wife present. In total, there are 43.5% more families residing in Warren than there were in 1990.

In Warren, there are 954 workers age 16 and over, which is a 50% increase from 1990. Approximately 35% of these workers work in Warren, while 65% work outside of the

community. The majority of workers, 87%, travel to work by car, truck, van, or motorcycle. Approximately 89% of those who travel to work by car, truck, van, or motorcycle drive alone, while 11% use carpools. See Table D. for other means of transportation used by workers in Warren. Although there are a range of travel times for Warren workers, 52% commute between 5 and 19 minutes. Approximately 16% commute between 20 and 39 minutes. Approximately 8% travel less than 5 minutes to work, while 2% travel more than 90 minutes to work from Warren.

In Warren, there were 419 people attending school at some level in 2000, which is a 93% increase from 1990. A range of educational attainment is represented by the population in Warren. Only 0.3% of all residents 25 years and older have not completed any level of schooling, while 18% have only a high school diploma. Approximately 53% of Warren residents 25 years and older hold some type of degree, ranging from an Associates degree to a Doctorate degree. See Table E. for details.

In Warren, there are 992 residents in the labor force, which is 74% of the population age 16 and over. This is a 37.4% increase from 1990. Approximately 98% of the people in the civilian labor force are employed, while 2% are unemployed. The 23 residents that are unemployed represent 61% less than the unemployment level in 1990. All of the industries covered in the Census are represented by residents of Warren. The industries with the largest percentage of workers are: arts, entertainment, recreation, accommodation, and food services, which represents 19.5% of employed residents; education, health, and social services, which represents 14.1% of employed residents;

retail trade, which represents 10.5% of employed residents; and construction, which represents 10.3% of employed residents. See Table F. for details.

Table G. shows household income and family income data for Warren. All income classes are represented here. Approximately 8% of the total households have an income of less than \$10,000; 19% have an income between \$10,000 and \$25,000; 28% have an income between \$25,000 and \$50,000; 23% have an income between \$50,000 and \$75,000; 9% have an income between \$75,000 and \$100,000; and 13% have an income above \$100,000. In 1999, the median household income in Warren was \$47,438, which is a 51.5% increase from 1990. Approximately 4% of the total families have an income of less than \$10,000; 10% have an income between \$10,000 and \$25,000; 27% have an income between \$25,000 and \$50,000; 28% have an income between \$50,000 and \$75,000; 12% have an income between \$75,000 and \$100,000; and 19% have an income above \$100,000. In 1999, the median family income in Warren was \$57,206, which is a 54.8% increase from 1990. In 1999, the per capita income for Warren was \$30,405, a 40.9% increase from 1990. Approximately 8% of people in Warren for whom poverty status is determined have incomes below poverty level. Unfortunately, the 134 residents who have incomes below poverty level are 63.4% more than those who suffered from poverty in 1990.

There are 2,078 total housing units in Warren, all of which are located in a rural area. This is a 6.6% increase from the total housing units in 1990. Only 36% of these housing units are currently occupied, leaving 64% vacant. Of these vacant housing units, 1% are

for rent, while 1% are for sale. Approximately 96% of the vacant housing units are for seasonal, recreational, or occasional use. There are currently 7% less housing vacancies in Warren than there were in 1990 and the occupancy level has increased by 44.9% over the last decade. See Table H. for details.

Of the 742 total occupied housing units in Warren, 67% are 1 to 2 person households, while 28% are 3 to 4 person households. Of the 2,078 total housing units in the Town, most have between 4 and 6 rooms. Approximately 5% have 1 to 2 rooms; 35% have 3 to 4 rooms; 40% have 5 to 6 rooms; 13% have 7 to 8 rooms; and 7% have 9 or more rooms. Many of the housing units in Warren were built prior to 1980. Approximately 9% of the houses were built before 1939; 54% were built between 1940 and 1979; and 37% were built after 1980. Approximately 98% of the total housing units in Warren contain complete plumbing facilities, leaving only 2% without adequate plumbing. See Table J. for details.
